

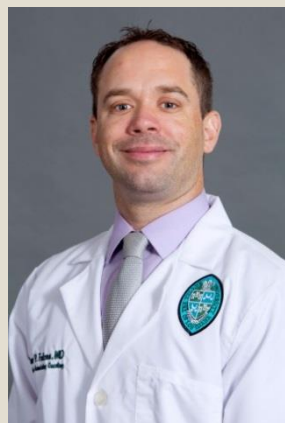

Dr. Corey Falcon, MD received his Bachelor's of Science Degree in Kinesiology with pre-medicine concentration from Louisiana State University and his medical degree from Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center-New Orleans. Dr. Falcon completed his residency training in Pediatrics at the San Antonio Uniformed Services Health Education Consortium. He then served as general Pediatrician and Major in the United States Air Force for four years. He went on to complete fellowship training in Pediatric Hematology and Oncology at the University of Alabama Birmingham in Birmingham, AL. He is Assistant Professor at Tulane University Medical School and has a clinical appointment at Children's Hospital of New Orleans. As a pediatric hematologist and a member of the Louisiana Center for Bleeding and Clotting Disorders, he provides clinical care to patients with Von Willebrand Disease, hemophilia, and many other disorders of hemostasis and thrombosis. His goals for the Malmö Course include expanding his knowledge of Von Willebrand Disease under the tutelage of experts in the field in order to enhance the care of his patients back home in Louisiana.
