Project Title: “Pediatric Antiphospholipid Syndrome: A National Registry”

Dr. Angela Weyand is an assistant professor in pediatric hematology and oncology at the University of Michigan Medical School with a focus on hemostasis and thrombosis. After growing up in Kansas City, she attended Northwestern University before heading to Ann Arbor, MI for medical school.

Following pediatrics residency at Seattle Children’s Hospital, she returned to the University of Michigan to complete her pediatric hematology and oncology fellowship. Dr. Weyand is particularly interested in the care of young women and girls with bleeding and clotting disorders, and co-directs a multidisciplinary clinic dedicated to this population. The objectives of her DREAM study are to identify and characterize pediatric patients with antiphospholipid antibody syndrome (APS) in the U.S. APS is a systemic disease characterized by persistently positive antiphospholipid antibodies in association with venous and/or arterial thrombosis. It is rare and understudied in children and adolescents and associated with significant morbidity and mortality. Through this multicenter collaborative approach, she hopes to gain insight into the presentation, practice patterns, and clinical outcomes of these patients to ultimately improve their care.
