**HTRS Trainee Workshop: “Building a Career in Hemostasis and Thrombosis”
Wednesday, November 28 - Thursday, November 29, 2018
Loews Coronado Bay, San Diego, CA**

The Hemostasis and Thrombosis Research Society (HTRS) is now accepting nominations for residents and fellows interested in pursuing careers in non-malignant hematology to attend the following HTRS Trainee Workshop:

- Title:** “Building a Career in Hemostasis and Thrombosis”
- Dates:** Evening of Wednesday, November 28 through Thursday, November 29, 2018 (prior to the 60th Annual Meeting of the American Society of Hematology in San Diego, CA (“ASH 2018”).
- Time:** The Workshop begins with a Welcome Reception and opening sessions Wednesday evening, November 28, from 5:00 PM to 9:00 PM PT. A full day of lectures, consultative case discussions, and interactive breakout sessions follows Thursday, November 29 from 7:15 AM to 4:30 PM PT.
- Location:** Loews Coronado Bay, 4000 Coronado Bay Road, Coronado, CA 92118

Applicant Eligibility Requirements

This Workshop is open to **30 MDs or DOs in training** (residents or fellows) interested in building careers in hemostasis and/or thrombosis in pediatric or adult medicine.

Workshop Description

This non-CME educational event will be held from November 28-29, 2018, just prior to the 60th Annual Meeting of the American Society of Hematology in San Diego, CA (“ASH 2018”). The goal of “Building a Career in Hemostasis and Thrombosis” is to attract trainees to the field of non-malignant hematology for the benefit of current and future patients with bleeding and thrombotic disorders. The program is a mix of case presentations by both faculty and trainees, didactic lectures, interactive breakout sessions, and time for networking with peers and mentors.

The scientific content and agenda for this Workshop are designed by the HTRS Trainee Workshop Planning Committee comprising HTRS physician members in hemostasis and thrombosis. The Committee ensures that the

program is free from commercial bias. (Although this Workshop is non-CME, HTRS follows best practices in CME education to plan and coordinate educational content.)

Nomination Deadline and Instructions

Hematology Medical Residency Program Directors and Fellowship Program Directors who wish to nominate one or more residents or fellows to attend this Workshop must do so **on or before Friday, October 12, 2018 by 11:59 p.m. ET.**

2. Upload Required Components for Nomination to the Online Form

The online Nomination Form includes fields to upload the following required documents:

- a. **Recommendation Statement.** The nominator (the applicant’s Medical Residency Program Director or Fellowship Program Director) should explain in 100 words or less why the applicant is a good candidate for the Workshop.
- b. **Candidate’s Statement.** The applicant should explain in 500 words or less why attending this Workshop is important to his/her career plans.
- c. The applicant’s **NIH Biosketch** or **Curriculum Vitae**

Notification of Acceptance

All nominations will be reviewed by the HTRS Trainee Workshop Planning Committee immediately following the October 12, 2018 deadline. Applicants will be notified of acceptance via email on or before October 26, 2018.

Expenses Covered by HTRS

The following expenses will be covered by HTRS for all confirmed Workshop attendees:

- **Travel.** Reimbursement not to exceed \$750.00 USD total will be provided with receipts toward the cost of:
 - Round-trip, coach class airline or train ticket booked by the attendee (includes fare and change fee, if incurred)
 - Ground transportation from the airport to the Workshop hotel and back (taxi, Uber, Lyft) or parking fees at the Workshop hotel
 - Up to \$60.00 USD per day for meals on two travel days
- **Lodging.** TMG will book all attendees a sleeping room at Loews Coronado Bay for the night of Wednesday, November 28. Additional nights are at the attendee’s own expense unless special arrangements are made with and approved by HTRS in advance.
- **Meals.** HTRS will provide meals during the Workshop including the Welcome Reception/Buffer Dinner on Wednesday, November 28 and breakfast, lunch, and refreshment breaks on Thursday, November 29. HTRS

will also reimburse for meals on travel days to and from the Workshop up to \$60.00 USD per day. (Any other meals are the responsibility of the attendee.)
