The Department of Biochemistry and Molecular Biology, School of Medicine, LSU Health Sciences Center is seeking a highly motivated postdoctoral fellow to work on an NIH-funded project on the relationship between oral contraception use and coagulopathy. Incumbent will work in the laboratory of Dr. Rinku Majumder.

This laboratory studies the role of Protein S, which is an essential natural anticoagulant. Specifically, our lab will use a genetically modified mouse model to investigate how obesity and oral contraception synergistically contribute to increased risk of blood clots. We are looking for someone experienced with handling mice, breeding, colony maintenance, drug administration, blood collection, and surgical procedures. We will be collaborating with researchers from Scripps Research Institute and UNC Chapel Hill to study thrombotic models in mice.
