Dr. Gary Woods, MD received his Bachelor of Science Degree from the University of Virginia in Charlottesville, VA and his medical degree from Eastern Virginia Medical School in Norfolk, VA. He completed his residency training in Pediatrics at the Children's Hospital of the King's Daughters/Eastern Virginia Medical School in Norfolk, VA and fellowship training in Pediatric Hematology and Oncology at Nationwide Children's Hospital in Columbus, OH. He was also the first Joan Pediatric Hemostasis and Thrombosis fellowship graduate from Nationwide Children's

Hospital. He is an Assistant Professor at Emory University and the Aflac Cancer and Blood Disorders Center at Children's Healthcare of Atlanta. As a pediatric hematologist, he has provided clinical care to patients with hemophilia and inhibitors for the inpatient hematology service and in the comprehensive bleeding disorder clinic as part of the pediatric hemophilia treatment center in the Children's Healthcare of Atlanta hospital system. His predominant take-away from this workshop is that with the varied approaches used to manage this complication around the world, special lab monitoring (including global hemostasis assays), could provide further insight into the appropriate management of this patient population.
