

## Assistant/Associate/Professor, Clinical Scholar Pathway in Department of Medicine

The Division of Hematology/Oncology in the Department of Medicine at the Larner College of Medicine, the University of Vermont is seeking a physician with experience in hematologic malignancies and autologous stem cell transplantation to join our academic faculty. The position is available at the rank of Assistant, Associate, or Professor in the Clinical Scholar Pathway and includes the opportunity to conduct clinical research and further multidisciplinary programs to care for patients with hematologic malignancies. There are also leadership opportunities within the division for the appropriate candidate including in a nascent CAR T-Cell therapy program as well as collaborative opportunities within the University of Vermont Health Network. The successful candidate must demonstrate a record of collaboration, excellence in clinical care, teaching and scholarship. The Division of Hematology/Oncology in the Department of Medicine has 15 faculty members and works closely with the University of Vermont Cancer Center (UVMCC). At the UVMCC, clinicians, scientists and epidemiologists work together to improve cancer and hematologic care delivery through the integration of basic, clinical and population research. The individual will deliver care and supervise residents and fellows on the inpatient and consultative hematology/oncology services including weekend call. The candidate should expect to actively participate in scheduled multidisciplinary hematology and transplant conferences.

Applicants must be ABIM board eligible in Hematology and/or Medical Oncology and certified in either Medical Oncology or Hematology if more than 3 years after completion of fellowship. Ideal candidates will possess the experience and skills to support research, advance the educational mission of the University, and/or develop and lead clinical programs. Candidates must be eligible for medical licensure in the State of Vermont, for privileges at UVM Medical Center, and for faculty appointment at the University of Vermont.
