**Assistant/Associate Clinical Professor, Non-Malignant Hematology**

The Division of Hematology/Oncology in the Department of Medicine at the University of California, San Francisco (UCSF) is recruiting for a new faculty member in non-malignant hematology. Fellowship training in non-malignant hematology is required. We have a superb, federally-funded Hemophilia Treatment Center and are most interested in applicants with interest and experience in hemostasis and thrombosis. However, additional areas of academic interest that fit particularly well with current goals include thrombosis and malignancy, bleeding and thrombosis in women, platelet disorders, and immune-mediated hematologic disorders. Clinical activities are central to the position, but applicants are expected to participate in division research activities. Interdisciplinary research that leverages the breadth and strength of UCSF is encouraged. Applicants who have successfully obtained peer-reviewed funding are particularly encouraged to apply. Candidates must be ABIM eligible or certified in Hematology.

The faculty member is expected to participate in the teaching and training of Hematology/Oncology fellows, residents and medical students, and to contribute to the division's annual scientific conference. The Division of Hematology/Oncology has a large fellowship program with a strong record of training fellows who go on to full-time academic positions as well as leadership positions in industry. Clinical activities will include attending on the inpatient hematology consultation service and in our outpatient non-malignant hematology clinic.
