Project Title: "Direct oral anticoagulants for simultaneous disease treatment and thromboprophylaxis in nephrotic syndrome"

Dr. Kerlin is a physician-scientist with expertise in hemostasis, thrombosis, and protease-activated receptor signaling. He is a Professor of Pediatrics at The Ohio State University College of Medicine. His research program, which focuses on understanding interactions between the hemostasis and kidney biology systems, is housed in the Center for Clinical and Translational Research at Nationwide Children's Hospital's Abigail Wexner Research Institute. He is also Director of The Joan Fellowship in Pediatric Hemostasis-Thrombosis. Dr. Kerlin studied Medical Laboratory Science at Purdue University and earned his MD at the Medical College of Wisconsin. He completed Pediatrics Residency at Phoenix Children's Hospital followed by Pediatric Hematology/Oncology Fellowship at the Medical

College of Wisconsin and Children's Hospital of Wisconsin. During fellowship, his research focused on the thrombo-inflammatory mechanisms of the thrombomodulin-protein C pathway in the laboratory of Hartmut Weiler, PhD, at the Versiti Blood Research Institute.
