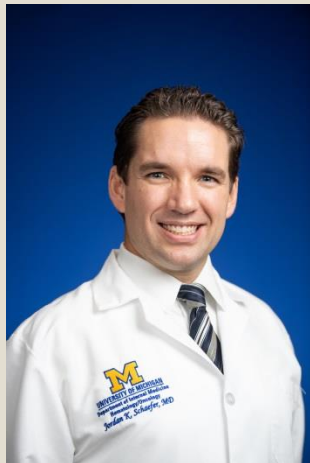

Project Title: “An Intervention to Reduce High Risk Primary Prevention Aspirin Use”

Dr. Schaefer is a hematologist at the University of Michigan specializing in disorders of hemostasis. He received his medical degree from Michigan State University’s College of Human Medicine and then completed an Internal Medicine residency at the Mayo Clinic in Rochester, MN followed by a Hematology/Oncology fellowship at the University of Michigan.

Thereafter, Dr. Schaefer joined the Hematology/Oncology faculty at the University of Michigan and is part of the University of Michigan Hemophilia and Coagulation Disorders Program. His clinical and research interests focus on health disparities in anticoagulation care, cancer associated thrombosis, and the optimal use of antiplatelet/anticoagulant therapies. His HTRS Mentored Research Award project seeks to develop and test a novel multilevel intervention to reduce high-risk ASA use and promote evidence-based aspirin use in the primary care setting.
