The Hemostasis & Thrombosis Research Society (HTRS) is accepting applications to attend the **HTRS 2023 Research Colloquium**, March 8-9, 2023 at the Renaissance Orlando at SeaWorld®. This non-CME education and career development event will be held prior to the HTRS 2023 Scientific Symposium (March 10-12, 2023).

#### **About the 2023 HTRS Research Colloquium**

The Colloquium is a 1.5-day, in-person workshop for early-career physician-scientists and/or postdoctoral investigators working to build sustainable academic research careers in hemostasis and thrombosis.

The goals of the Colloquium are to:

- Foster lasting connections between early-career physician-scientists and basic or translational scientists that can lead to collaborative research
- Provide continuing education and career development support for junior faculty and/or postdoctoral attendees looking to build a sustainable research career in classical hematology

## Applicant Eligibility

- Attendance is limited to 30 in-person attendees
- Ideal applicants are MDs, DOs, MD/PhDs, or PhDs within seven (7) years of completing medical fellowship and/or doctoral education/training
- Successful applicants will demonstrate an interest in furthering their academic research careers by networking with peers and Colloquium faculty experienced in clinical science, basic science, translational science, and industry-based research
- Preference is given to early-career physician-scientists or postdoctoral investigators with some research experience (e.g. NIH K-Award candidates/recipients or early-stage RO1 awardees). Third- or fourth-year medical fellows and doctoral candidates may apply to attend if they can successfully demonstrate a strong commitment to building a research career in hemostasis or thrombosis upon completion of training
- The Colloquium's agenda and learning objectives are designed by the members of the 2023 HTRS Research Colloquium Planning Committee, who ensure that event content is free from commercial bias
- The Colloquium does not offer Continuing Medical Education (CME) credits; however, HTRS follows best practices in CME education to plan and coordinate the Colloquium

### Application Materials

- Biosketch or CV
- Headshot (200 pixels by 200 pixels)
- Bio (500 words or less)
- Personal Statement (500 words or less) - explaining why this Colloquium is important to your career goals
- Letter of Recommendation (500 words or less) - letter written and signed by your mentor or director explaining why you are a good candidate to attend the Colloquium (*optional*)

### Notification of Acceptance

Applicants will be notified by HTRS of acceptance via email on or before **Wednesday, November 16, 2022 at 12:00 PM Eastern Time.**

Accepted applicants receive:

- Round-trip travel expense reimbursement (not to exceed \$750 USD). Travel to be booked by the attendee
- No-cost lodging for the night of March 8 at the Renaissance Orlando at SeaWorld®
- Meals provided during the event
- Waived registration to attend the HTRS Scientific Symposium immediately following the Colloquium from March 10-12
