- Completed Pediatric Hematology/Oncology fellowship prior to matriculation
- American Board of Pediatrics Eligible or Certified in Pediatric Hematology/Oncology prior to matriculation
- If not a U.S. citizen or permanent resident, able to obtain a current J-1 or H1B VISA
